- 13 SEP** **The Divine Order** (2017)
Switzerland | Comedy/Drama | 96 mins
Switzerland, 1971: Nora is a young housewife and mother who lives with her husband, their two sons and her father-in-law in a little village. She is a quiet, retiring person liked by everyone - until she begins to campaign publicly and pugnaciously for women's right to vote. Winner at Tribeca Film Festival. Dir: Petra Biondina Volpe.
- 11 OCT** **The Square** (2017)
Sweden | Comedy/Drama | 140 mins
A prestigious Stockholm museum's chief art curator finds himself in times of both professional and personal crisis as he attempts to set up a controversial new exhibit. Oscar & Golden Globe nominated - stars Elizabeth Moss and Dominic West. Dir: Ruben Östlund.
- 08 NOV** **Loveless** (2017)
Russia | Drama | 127 mins
A couple going through a divorce must team up to find their son who has disappeared during one of their bitter arguments. Same director as *Leviathan*. BAFTA and Oscar nominated. Dir: Andrey Zvyagintsev.
- 13 DEC** **The Other Side of Hope** (2017)
Finland/Germany | Comedy Drama | 98 mins
Unlikely friendship between a Syrian asylum seeker and an elderly Finnish restaurant owner. Berlin Film Festival winner for best director, nominated for best film. Dir: Aki Kaurismäki.
- 10 JAN** **In the Fade** (2017)
Germany | Crime Drama | 106 mins
Katja's life collapses after the death of her husband and son in a bomb attack. After a time of mourning and injustice, Katja seeks revenge. Golden Globe winner, Oscar nominated. Dir: Fatih Akin.
- 14 FEB** **A Pigeon Sat on a Branch Reflecting on Existence** (2014)
Sweden | Comedy Drama | 101 mins
Sam and Jonathan, a pair of hapless novelty salesmen, embark on a tour of the human condition in reality and fantasy that unfolds in a series of absurdist episodes. Multi award winning. Dir: Roy Andersson
- 14 MAR** **I Am Not a Witch** (2017)
UK/France/Germany | Drama | 93 mins
Following a banal incident in her local village, 8 year old Shula is accused of witchcraft. After a short trial she is found guilty, taken into state custody and exiled to a witch camp in the middle of a desert. At the camp she takes part in an initiation ceremony where she is shown the rules surrounding her new life as a witch. Dir: Rungano Nyoni.
- 11 APR** **Bombshell – The Hedy Lamarr Story** (2017)
USA | Documentary | 88 mins
Hedy Lamarr was a Hollywood movie star who was hailed as the most glamorous in the world. However, this obscured her astounding true talents. Foremost of which was her inventive genius that a world blinded by her beauty could not recognize. Dir: Alexandra Dean.
- 09 MAY** **Shoplifters** (2018)
Japan | Crime Drama | 121 mins
A Japanese couple stuck with part-time jobs and inadequate incomes avail themselves of the fruits of shoplifting to make ends meet. Their lives are affected when they take in a child they find on the street. Cannes' Palme d'Or 2018 winner. Dir: Hirokazu Kore-eda.
- 13 JUN** **Boy** (2010)
New Zealand | Comedy Drama | 87 mins
New Zealand, 1984: Boy, an 11 year old Michael Jackson fan, is reunited with his criminal father but finds he isn't the man he thought he was. Winner of best film at Berlin. Dir: Taika Waititi.
- 29 NOV** **Sweet Country** (2017)
Australia | Crime Drama | 113 mins
Australian western set on the Northern Territory frontier in the 1920s, where justice itself is put on trial when an aged Aboriginal farmhand shoots a white man in self defence and goes on the run as a posse gathers to hunt him down. Dir: Warwick Thornton.
- 28 MAR** **Ivan's Childhood** (1962 - re-released 2016)
USSR | Drama | 95 mins
In WW2, 12 year old Soviet orphan Ivan Bondarev works for the Soviet army as a scout behind German lines and strikes up a friendship with three sympathetic Soviet officers. Multi ward winning. Dir: Andrei Tartovsky.
